The full paper should be of 3000 words. The body of manuscript must be prepared on standard A4 size paper setting. It must be prepared on a 1.5 spacing and single column with 1" margin set for top, bottom, left and right. It should be typed in 12-point Times New Roman font with page numbers at the bottom-centre of every page. All section headings should be in 14-point Times New Roman font and sub-section headings should be in 12-point Times New Roman font. These must be bold-faced, aligned left and fully capitalized. Leave a blank line before each heading, Figures & Tables. The titles of figures/tables should be numbered and placed above the figure/table. Sources of figures/tables should be mentioned below them. Citation & References within the text and at the end of the paper should be in the APA style.
