Guidelines for Submission of Full Paper

The full paper should be of 3000 words. The body of manuscript must be prepared on standard A4 size paper setting. It must be prepared on a 1.5 spacing and single column with 1" margin set for top, bottom, left and right. It should be typed in 12-point Times New Roman font with page numbers at the bottom-centre of every page. All section headings should be in 14-point Times New Roman font and sub-section headings should be in 12-point Times New Roman font. These must be bold-faced, aligned left and fully capitalized. Leave a blank line before each heading, Figures & Tables. The titles of figures/tables should be numbered and placed above the figure/table. Sources of figures/tables should be mentioned below them. Citation & References within the text and at the end of the paper should be in the APA style, as prescribed in the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (Latest edition).
